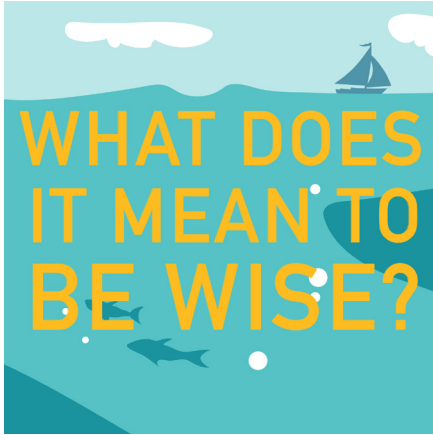


Spend some time thinking about the question below and journal your thoughts or share them with a parent.

Day 2

Read Luke 2:41-52

As you read Luke 2:41-52, track the separate journeys of Jesus and His parents using two different colors in your Bible. If you are using a Bible app, you can grab a sheet of paper and two different colored writing utensils. Write Nazareth on the left side of the paper and Jerusalem on the right, then draw lines back and forth representing the separate journeys Jesus and His parents took.

There were a couple of different searches happening in this story in the book of Luke. What were they?



Answers: Jesus' parents searching for Him, and Jesus searching for wisdom in the temple

Day 3

Jesus went to talk to the Jewish teachers in the temple—a place He referred to as His “Father’s house.”

What’s really awesome though is that we don’t have to go anywhere special to learn more about God. We have God’s Word always available to us, and we can also talk to God wherever we are, whenever we want to, to ask for wisdom. Pray this prayer below or say your own prayer asking God for wisdom.

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**Dear God,** thank You for making Your wisdom available to me through Your Word. I am so thankful that if I don’t know what to do, all I have to do is turn to Your Word and talk to You to find Your wisdom. I want to make the wise choice, so please give me Your wisdom. In Jesus’ Name, I pray. **Amen.**

## Day 4
